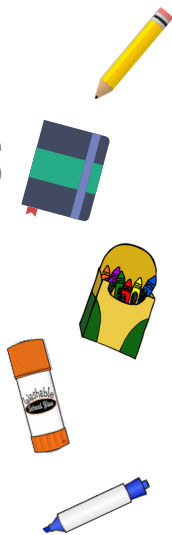

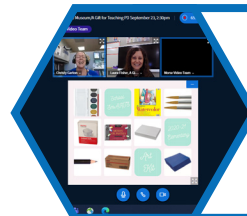
#### Free Teacher Supply Store
